## **BLACK & BROWN ON BLUE: PIERCING THE POLICE WALL OF SILENCE**

Heroic activists have pushed for change in policing for years, but recently push has come from police officers themselves. The NYPD 12, and the PG13, are current examples. In 2015, 12 people of color officers filed a landmark class-action lawsuit in NY over illegal policing quotas. In 2018 13 Prince George's County police officers of color filed suit, accusing the department of discrimination and retaliation for reporting other officers' bad behavior.
